Drip faucets, prepare items including medications, keep apartment at 65 degrees or higher. •Michael Gerber, President and CEO, wished everyone a Happy New Year and provided updates on the successful visit of HUD Secretary, Adrienne Todman. Mr. Gerber expressed that HACA is very grateful for resident leadership and community partners such as Austin Habitat for Humanity for bringing the Prospect Heights homeownership program to life. •Leilani Lim-Villegas, HACA Senior Director of Community Development, congratulated the new resident council officers. HACA will be hosting a training to install new resident leadership in February. •Abigail Bettini, HACA Family Self-Sufficiency Manager, reported that Southwest NAHRO scholarship applications are due on March 14th. For residents at Chalmers and Meadowbrook, please reach out to your ROSS Specialist if you need any basic needs or community resources. •Murphy Roland, HACA Workforce Development Manager, announced that there are 6 residents enrolled in the Good Neighbor Safety Ambassador program. Staff is still recruiting more resident ambassadors to make sure that every property has representation. •Borami Lee, HACA Health & Wellness Manager, announced that the Mobile vaccine clinic will be at Gaston from noon to 2:00 PM on January 14th. ITEM 2: Presentation, Discussion, and Possible Action Regarding Resolution No. 02876 by the Board of Commissioners of the Housing Authority of the City of Austin (the "Authority") to take the following actions with regard to the Bridge at Midtown Commons Apartments (the "Development") in Austin, Texas: (i) acquire the site of the Development; (ii) lease the Development site to the owner of the Development; and (iii) such other actions necessary or convenient to carry out this Resolution

Austin Affordable Housing Corporation (AAHC) was presented with an opportunity to partner with Belveron Partners to purchase a 562-unit multi-family rental property called Midtown Commons at Crestview Station Apartments. The development is located at 810 W. St. Johns Ave., Austin, Texas 78752. This would be the nineteenth (19th) asset AAHC and Belveron Corporation have purchased together. This asset is located adjacent to the Crestview MetroRail Station and there is a Capital Metro bus stop directly in front of the station and is located just 2 miles from the ACC Highland Campus. The property also includes a two-story retail and office building with a diverse tenant mix. AAHC and Belveron will be in search of a non-profit tenant to occupy the vacated office space immediately upon closing.

AAHC's proposed partner, Belveron Corporation prides itself on long term preservation of workforce housing. Located out of San Francisco, Belveron is a privately held investment firm with a current portfolio of more than 30,000 units across the United States. Founded in 2006, Belveron has invested in more than 220 ties in 32 states. AAHC works with the Managing Partner, Paul Odland, and Senior Portfolio Manager, Josh Plattner.

The Midtown Commons at Crestview Station was a two-phase development, with the first stage completed in 2010 and the second phase completed in 2014. The property sits on 8.19 acres. Some of the property amenities include two resort-style swimming pools with lounge seating and cabanas, elegant clubhouse with gathering spaces and full conference room, two 24-hour fitness centers and spin rooms, a billiards lounge with full kitchen and coffee bar, and business center. Residents can also enjoy the spacious courtyards with grilling areas and a gathering pavilion. The property feeds into the Austin Independent School District Brentwood Elementary School, Lamar Middle School, and McCallum High School. Due to the property's proximity to the nearby rail and bus stations, AAHC and Belveron are well-positioned to offer stable and affordable housing to stakeholders in the area.

This is an important transaction to HACA and AAHC as this part of Austin continues to displace the affordable community. This partnership will preserve this asset and add deeper affordability for our current voucher holders and the residents that reside in this area.

The property is currently 96% occupied and rents currently range from \$1,358 for a studio to \$2,606 for a two bedroom.

The purchase price for Midtown Commons at Crestview Station is \$135,000,000. Belveron will be investing approximately \$33,000,000 as a down payment. In addition, \$4,000,000.00 for future capital needs will be set aside. Bellwether will be providing a Fannie Mae permanent loan with a not to exceed loan amount of \$102,000,000 at a rate of approximately 5.80% with a 35-year amortization. A current lease audit is underway to determine the initial number of units already qualified under 80% AMI. The property is currently 96% occupied. AAHC and Belveron are committed to providing 10% of the affordable units at 60% AMI, 40% of the units at 80% AMI and marketing units to HCV voucher holders. Apartment Management Professionals will manage the property. The new name for the property will be Bridge at Midtown Commons Apartments.

Commissioner Carrington seconded the motion. The motion Passed (5-Ayes and 0-Nays).

ITEM 3: Presentation, Discussion, and Possible Action Regarding Resolution No. 02877: Approval of an Award of Contract to Paradigm Construction for Phase I Construction Services at HACA's Headquarters Campus

The Board was asked to approve a Guaranteed Maximum Price contract with Paradigm Commercial for \$3,943,728 for Phase 1 construction services at HACA's headquarters campus.

Since 2024, the Housing Authority of the City of Austin has engaged in a comprehensive headquarters renovation planning process to repair, renovate and modernize its headquarters for the first time since occupying its current headquarters campus. HACA enlisted the project management services of Project Management Advisors, Inc. (PMA) to assist in this major undertaking.

As requested by HACA, PMA undertook a competitive proposal process for the selection of a general contractor for the Phase 1 Renovation of the Housing Authority of the City of Austin (HACA) headquarters project. Phase 1 includes the following: first floor - the construction of an all-hands meeting space and break room, Admissions office and work space, Board of Commissioners meeting room, conference rooms, ADA-accessible restrooms; second floor – Austin Affordable Housing Corporation (AAHC) office and work spaces, Southwest Housing Compliance Corporation (SHCC) office and work spaces, Austin Pathways (AP) office and work spaces; conference and phone rooms, small break room, mail/copy room, ADA-accessible restrooms.

A competitive RFP process was run in August 2024 and Paradigm Commercial ("Paradigm") was selected as the pre-construction manager. Paradigm has been providing regular cost advice, value-engineering advice, lead time analyses, scheduling insights, and on-site investigations. These efforts were instrumental in identifying potential risks and opportunities for improvement.

After the conclusion of the value engineering and on-site investigations, the construction documentation was finalized. Paradigm then sought a minimum of three (3) bids for each of the required trades to complete the works and has provided a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) offer to HACA for the works.

Additionally, HACA secured quotes for audio visual services necessary to install equipment and wiring in meeting spaces and work stations for Phase 1. HACA selected the most competitive proposal, which was provided by Mood:Solutions. Several additional door access card readers will also be installed as part of the Phase 1 renovation project.

After a review on both a quantitative and qualitive basis and upon consultation with PMA, it was HACA's recommendation to: 1. Approve the nomination of Paradigm Commercial as the General Contractor; and

- 2. Enter into a Guaranteed Maximum Price contract with Paradigm Commercial for \$3,943,728. A small contingency of \$202,217
- is also recommended for any unforeseen conditions; and
- 3. Accept the proposal from Mood:Solutions for audio/visual design, equipment and installation services for Phase 1 renovations not to exceed \$250,000; and
- 4. Approve the installation of door access card readers for an amount not to exceed \$22,000

2nd Vice-Chairperson Apostolou moved the Approval of Resolution No. 02877: Approval of an Award of Contract to Paradigm Construction for Phase I Construction Services at HACA's Headquarters Campus for in an amount of \$3,943,728, with a small contingency of \$202,217; and Accept the proposal from Mood:Solutions for audio/visual design, equipment and installation services for Phase 1 renovations not to exceed \$250,000; and Approve the installation of door access card readers for an amount not to exceed \$22,000. **Commissioner Carrington** seconded the motion. The motion Passed (5-Ayes and 0-Nays).

ACTION

The Board is being asked to approve Resolution No. 02878: Approval of the revised Housing Choice Voucher Program Utility Allowance Schedules. This is a routine annual action item.

SUMMARY

Background:

Per 24 CFR 982.517, HUD regulations require housing authorities to review utility allowance schedules annually and revise its allowance for a utility category if there has been a change of 10% or more in that category since the last revision.

Process:

Residential Life Utility Allowances, a Division of the Nelrod Company, recently completed the annual utility allowance review for HACA's Housing Choice Voucher Program. A comparison was made between the utility rates shown in the previous study compared to the current utility rates.

This comparison indicated the following:

• Austin Energy's electric tier-1 rates increased by 8%, tier-2 rates decreased by 7%, tier-3 rates increased by 8%, the monthly charge increased by 16%, and taxes remained the same.

• Texas Gas Services' natural gas rates decreased 15%, the monthly charges increased 12%, and taxes remained the same.

• Multi-Family water rates increased 8%, the monthly charges increased 2%, sewer rates increased 15% and their monthly charges increased 8%

• Single-Family water tier-1 rates increased 14%, tier-2 rates increased 11%, tier-3 rates increased 14%, and the monthly charges increased 5% each

• Sewer rates tier-1 increased 11%, tier-2 increased 11%, and the monthly charges increased 8%.

• Trash collection monthly charge increased 5% for 0-2 br, 3-5 br increased 6% each, and taxes remained the same.

The review indicated that overall rates and charges changed by more than 10%, and therefore the current utility allowance scheduled should be adjusted.

Resident Life also completed a multi-family energy efficient utility allowance schedule for energy efficient multi-family tax credit developments. Resident Life used HUD's Utility Schedule Model to calculate the base community-wide consumptions, which take into consideration current usage patterns and more energy-efficient equipment. The tool provides an Energy Star option and this was selected to modify consumption averages for the multi-family energy efficient utility allowance schedule.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approving the seven (7) revised utility allowance schedules.

The proposed revised utility allowance schedules are reflected in Attachment 1, the current utility allowance schedules are included as Attachment 2, and the complete 2024 utility allowance study is included as Attachment 3.

The revised utility allowance schedules will be effective June 1, 2025, for participants who are issued new vouchers and for annual re-examinations. The multi-family energy efficient utility allowance schedule will be effective February 20, 2025, and be available for use for any qualified energy-efficient multi-family tax credit property, per HACA and HUD approval.

Approval of the adoption of the revised Housing Choice Voucher Utility Allowance Schedules

WHEREAS, Federal Regulations require housing authorities to review utility allowance schedule(s) annually and adjust the schedule(s) if there has been a 10% or more rate change per category since the last revision; and

WHEREAS, Residential Life Utility Allowances, a Division of the Nelrod Company completed the utility allowance review for the Housing Choice Voucher Program and as required by HUD regulations 24 CFR 982.517, a comparison was made of the utility rates utilized in the previous study compared to the current utility rates; and

WHEREAS, the utility allowance review indicated that utility providers' rates have changed more than 10%, therefore, staff recommends revising the utility allowance schedules as reflected in Attachment 1; and

WHEREAS, Federal Regulations require the use of the revised utility allowance schedules at the next annual reexamination; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of Austin proposes to use the revised utility allowance schedules for new families assisted under the Housing Choice Voucher Program and current participants with reexaminations effective June 1, 2025 or later; and

WHEREAS, Resident Life Utility Allowances also completed a Multi-family Energy Efficient Utility Allowance Schedule for qualified energy efficient tax credit properties; and

WHEREAS, HACA proposes the application of the new Multi-family Energy Efficient Utility Allowance Schedule for any qualified energy efficient multi-family tax credit property, per HACA and HUD approval, effective February 20, 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Housing Authority of the City of Austin's Board of Commissioners approves and adopts the revised Utility Allowance Schedules for the Housing Choice Voucher Program and the new Multi-family Energy Efficient Utility Allowance Schedule.

OBJECTIVES AND METHODOLOGY Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program (Standard and Energy Efficient) ANNUAL UPDATE 2024

Utility Rate Comparison

As required by HUD regulations 24 CFR 982.517, prior to beginning this update study for the Housing Authority of the City of Austin, TX, a comparison (annual review) was made of the utility rates and charges (November 2023) utilized in the previous study and the current utility rates and charges (November 2024). This comparison indicated that Austin Energy's electric tier-1 rates increased 8%, tier-2 rates increased 7%, tier-3 rates increased 8%, the monthly charge increased 16%, and taxes remained the same. Texas Gas Services' natural gas rates increased 15%, the monthly charges increased 12%, and taxes remained the same. Austin Water's Multi-Family water rates increased 8% and the monthly charges increased 2%, sewer rates increased 15% and the monthly charges increased 8%, and Single-Family water tier-1 rates increased 14%, tier-2 rates increased 11%, tier-3 rates increased 14%, and the monthly charges increased 5% each 2%, sewer rates tier-1 increased 11%, tier-2 increased 11%, and the monthly charges increased 8%. And trash collection monthly charge increased 8% for 0-2 brr, 3-5 brr increased 7% each, and taxes remained the same. (See comparison in Support Documentation section of this report.) Since the utility providers' rates and charges have changed more than 10%, the current utility allowance schedule will be adjusted. This does not mean that utility allowances will change by the actual percentage values listed above.

Objective

The objective of this study is to update current **standard** and **energy efficient** Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program utility allowances for electricity, natural gas, water, sewer, and trash collection with current rates and charges for each utility provider. HUD's Utility Schedule Model **(HUSM-Ver13i_813_Summit-Update)** will be used in this update study.

This Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program update study will be conducted in accordance with HUD Regulations 24 CFR 982.517 Utility Allowance Schedule.

Methodology

The following steps were taken by a utility allowances specialist to accomplish the above objective:

1. <u>Utility Rates and Charges</u>

The following information was obtained by a rate specialist and input in the Utility Providers Residential Rates and Charges document:

- a. Documentation on current residential **electric** rates and charges from **Austin Energy** through their internet website and telephone inquiries.
- b. Documentation on current residential **natural gas** rates and charges from **Texas Gas Service** through their internet website and telephone inquiries.
- c. Documentation on current residential **water and sewer** rates and charges from **Austin Water** through their internet website and telephone inquiries.
- d. Documentation on current residential **trash collection** charges from the **Austin Water** through their internet website and telephone inquiries.

2. <u>Comparison of Utility Rates and Charges</u>

A rate specialist created charts comparing the previously applied electric, natural gas, water, sewer, and trash collection rates and charges for each provider to their current utility rates and charges. These charts calculate a percentage difference.

A rate specialist then analyzed the comparison charts and emailed the draft charts to the Agency with the recommendation to adjust current utility allowances due to a greater than 10% change in utility rates (HUD Regulations 24 CFR 982.517(c)(1)).

3. <u>Data Gathering</u>

a. Currently Adopted Utility Allowances

A copy of the currently adopted Section 8 HCV Utility Allowance Schedules was requested and received from the Agency.

b. Monthly Utility Consumption Averages and Climatic Adjustment

HUD's Utility Schedule Model (Ver13i_813_Summit-Update) was utilized for the base community-wide consumptions which take into consideration current usage patterns and more energy efficient equipment. This tool provides for a "Green Discount" choice of "None" (Standard), "Energy Star", "LEED", or "Significant Green Retrofit". Choosing "None" provides "Standard" equipment and measures, and choosing "Energy Star", "LEED", or "Significant Green Retrofit" provides "Energy Efficient" equipment and measures. Each selection modifies the consumption averages.

In this engineering-methodology study "**None**" was chosen for **standard utility allowances** and "**Energy Star**" was chosen for **Energy Efficient** utility allowances.

The HUSM tool provides a choice of locations for the climatic adjustment of the base consumptions, by housing agency code or zip code. For agencies that cover more than one climatic zone, we utilize climatic data from the PHA_Average_HDD-CDD spreadsheet to determine the appropriate base consumptions.

HUD's tool combines consumptions and utility allowances for the building types, **Row House and Semi-Detached** together on one form HUD-52667.

Water average consumption is based on a national average, acquired via internet research, per building type and bedroom size.

There was no change in the consumption averages from the last study.

4. <u>Utility Allowance Adjustments (Cost of Consumption)</u>

The following steps were taken by a utility allowance specialist:

- a. Updated the Cost of Consumption charts from the previous study with current utility rates and charges for **electric** usage for each building type and each bedroom size.
- b. Updated the Cost of Consumption charts from the previous study with current utility rates and charges for **natural gas** usage for each building type and each bedroom size.

- c. Updated the Cost of Consumption charts from the previous study with current utility rates and charges for **water and sewer** usage for **each provider**, each building type, and each bedroom size.
- d. Applied the current **trash collection** charge.

These new utility allowances were entered into **7** forms HUD-52667 for applicable building types.

5. <u>Section 8 Utility Allowance Schedules - Form HUD-52667</u>

ResidentLife Utility Allowances[®] has provided **7** updated forms HUD-52667, one each for **Multi-Family (Elevator), Multi-Family (Apartment), Row House/ Townhouse, Semi-Detached/Duplex, Single-Family (Detached House),** and **Manufactured/Mobile**, and a **Multi-Family Energy Efficient**.

NOTE 1: The **Natural Gas** utility provider has a **monthly customer charge** that is not based on consumption. This charge is shown in the "Other–Specify:" row of the form HUD-52667. This charge should be added for residents utilizing this utility but add it only one time. (See Explanation...Monthly Fixed Charges following these HUD forms). The **Electric** utility provider has a **Monthly Charge** that is not based on consumption. This charge has been calculated from the "Other Electric, Lighting, Refrigeration, Etc." calculations and is included in the "Other Electric" (Lights & Appliances) row of the form HUD-52667, **per the Agency**.

NOTE 2: If the owner/landlord does not provide a range or refrigerator with the leased unit, the agency must provide an allowance for the **tenant-provided range or refrigerator**, to supplement maintenance costs, and should be based on the lesser of the cost of leasing or installment purchasing of suitable equipment. Microwave applies only to studio/efficiency units that do not have a range/stove cooking source. Who provided the range and refrigerator must be indicated on the Request for Tenancy Approval (RFTA)and dwelling unit lease.

NOTE 3: For your convenience, we have provided utility allowances for Reasonable Accommodations medical equipment.

NOTE 4: On December 20, 2018, HUD revised the Section 8 HCV utility allowance regulations (24 CFR §982.517) item (d) Use of Utility Allowances Schedule, to now specify "The PHA must use the appropriate utility allowance for the lesser of the size of dwelling unit actually leased by the family or the family unit size as determined under the PHA subsidy standards." See HUD regulations for the exceptions.

NOTE 5: According to HUD's instructions provided with form HUD-52667, this form shall be reproduced by the Agency and given to families with their Voucher or subsequently in connection with any revisions. This form will provide the family, while shopping for a unit, with the amount of the allowances for various types of units for rent. With these allowances the family can compare gross rents and fair market rents. This form shall also be used by the Agency to record the actual allowance for each family and this form must be maintained in the tenant's file.

6. <u>Support Documentation</u>

Per HUD regulations (24 CFR 982.517(c)(1)), the Agency must maintain information supporting its annual review of utility allowances and any revisions made in its utility allowance schedule.

This report contains a copy of all such supporting documentation.

7. <u>Annual Update</u>

Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher HUD regulations (24 CFR 982.517(a)(2)) state that housing authorities <u>must</u> review its schedule of utility allowances each year, and <u>must</u> revise its allowance for a utility category if there has been a change of 10% or more in the utility rate since the last time the utility allowance schedule was revised. If the Energy Efficient utility allowances are going to be used by affordable housing Tax Credit developers and builders, these allowances must be updated annually, regardless of 10% rate change.

8. <u>Submission of Adopted Utility Allowance Schedule</u>

According to Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program HUD Regulations (24 CFR 982.517(a)(2)), a copy of the adopted utility allowance schedules (form HUD-52667) <u>must</u> be sent to your local HUD Field Office. At HUD's request, the Agency also must provide any information or procedures used in the preparation of the schedule.

9. <u>Reasonable Accommodations</u>

We have provided utility allowances for Reasonable Accommodations medical equipment. If a family has a person with disabilities, and they need a higher utility allowance as a reasonable accommodation (in accordance with 24 CFR part 8, they may make a request to the housing agency. Therefore, the **Housing Authority of the City of Austin, TX** is updating utility allowances (using HUSM, conversion factors, and national averages) for electricity, natural gas, water, sewer, and trash collection for a **Section 8 HCV Multi-Family (Elevator), Multi-Family (Apartment), Row House/Townhouse, Semi-Detached /Duplex, Single-Family (Detached House), and Manufactured/Mobile Home, and a Multi-Family Energy Efficient**.

This update study was conducted in accordance with HUD Regulations 24 CFR 982.517 Utility Allowance Schedule (Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program). HUSM-Ver13i_813_Summit-Update was used.

Oxygen Concentrator

Use per day varies, assume 12-14 hours a day. The 5-Liter model uses 400 W, the 3-Liter model uses 320 W.

Nebulizer

A medicine delivery system used mostly for pediatric care.Used 4-6 times a day for 20 minutes at a time at 75W.

Semi/Fully Electric Hospital Bed

Use depends on adjustments. 200 W.

Alternating Pressure Pad

An air-filled mattress overlay. Used 24 hours a day for someone who is bed-ridden.

Low Air-Loss Mattress

Takes the place of mattress - air -filled pressurized mattress.Cycles air around every 15-20 minutes.

Power Wheelchairs and Scooters

Need to be charged approximately 8 hours every 3 days. Batteries are 120 V, 3 Amp, 360 W.

Feeding Tube Pump (Continuous Feed)

A pump delivers a constant amount of formula throughout the day or night.

CPAP Machine

For Sleep Apnea. Runs only at night for people who have a tendency to stop breathing at night. At maximum pressure use is 40 Watts. On average - 30 Watts

Leg Compression Pump

Provides intensive compression therapy. Use varies, generally from 8-24 hours daily.

Dialysis Machine/Equipment (Small/Portable)

Filters a patient's blood to remove excess water and waste products. Used 2 hours daily.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR HUD FORMS-52667 UTILITY ALLOWANCE SCHEDULE

PHAs must maintain a completed HUD Form-52667 Utility Allowance Schedule for each unit type that is typical in the PHA's jurisdiction. The utility allowance schedule is based on the typical cost of utilities and services paid by energy conservation households that occupy housing of similar size and type in the same locality. In developing the schedule, the PHA must use normal patterns of consumption for the community as a whole and current utility rates.

This form includes the utilities that the PHA must consider: heating (space), cooking, other electric (e.g. lights, appliances, general usage), air conditioning (if the majority of housing units in the market provide centrally airconditioned units or there is appropriate wiring for tenant-installed air conditioners), water heating, water, sewer, trash, the cost to provide a range, and the cost to provide a refrigerator. This form includes several fuel types, however, the PHA is not required to have a utility allowance for every fuel type listed on the form. The PHA is only required to have an allowance for the fuel types that are typical in the PHA's jurisdiction.

Electric resistance vs. electric heat pump: The most recent update to the HUD-52667 includes "Electric Heat Pump" as a fuel type under "Heating". PHAs may choose to provide an allowance on the schedule for electric (resistance), electric heat pump, or both. Heat pumps are more efficient and are associated with lower consumption. By adding this to the form, HUD is not requiring PHAs to consider both. This is up to the PHA, however, the HUD Utility Schedule Model tool available on HUDUser.gov provides an allowance for both electric resistance and electric heat pump.

Determining Allowances: In general, PHAs use local sources of information on the cost of utilities and services, such as:

- 1. Electric utility suppliers
- 2. Natural gas utility suppliers
- 3. Water and sewer suppliers
- 4. Fuel oil and bottled gas suppliers
- 5. Public service commissions
- 6. Real estate and property management firms
- 7. State and local agencies
- 8. Appliance sales and leasing firms

PHAs may use the HUD Utility Schedule Model (HUSM) available on HUDuser.org to determine their Utility Allowance Schedules. The tool uses geographic-specific utility consumption rates combined with user entered data on utility rates to determine the overall monthly allowance

Explanation of Utility Provider Monthly Fixed Charges (Monthly Customer Charge - See "Other-specify")

- Fact 1: Utility providers do not separate consumption usage like that required for the form HUD-52667 (by end-uses: Space Heating is Natural Gas; Cooking is Natural Gas; Water Heating is Natural Gas; or Space Heating is Electric; etc.).
- Fact 2: Most utility providers bill their customers a service charge that is not based on usage. It is usually called a Monthly Customer Charge (e.g. Base Charge, Service Availability Charge, etc.). Some utility providers have an ongoing monthly (or Semi-Annual) credit. It is added to (or subtracted from) the customer's bill each month. Even if the client does not use any utilities during the month, they are still billed a monthly service charge.
- Fact 3: Per HUD regulations, Section 8 HCV Utility Allowances are based on the community as-awhole. Your agency doesn't necessarily know in advance what utilities the tenant will have to pay, or whether the unit has natural gas appliances, bottle gas service, etc.

Service Fixed Charge (Monthly Customer Charge)

Therefore, since the service charge is not based on consumption usage, it cannot be divided equally between the end-uses on the form HUD-52667. That is why HUD supplied a row on the utility allowance schedule labeled **"Other-specify"**. This row is to be used for **any monthly charges** that cannot be divided or combined with any other end-use. Some examples of customer charges: extermination charge for mosquito spraying (which is billed to tenant by the City even though the tenant themselves do not pay for water usage); fire protection charge; street lights; etc.).

Calculating Total Utility Allowances on form HUD-52667

Natural Gas Service Monthly Fixed Charge

When the total utility allowance is calculated for a particular unit which has natural gas appliances, if the tenant pays natural gas utilities, and the utility provider has a monthly service charge, **add the service charge amount once in the "per month cost" column on the form HUD-52667**. It does not matter how many appliances the tenant has that are fueled by natural gas.

Electric Service Monthly Fixed Charge

All dwelling units are supplied with electricity. Some housing agency's management systems software is not designed with these separate allowances entry, therefore, they have chosen to include the **electric monthly charge** in the calculations in the "Other Electric (Lights and Appliances) allowances.

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1. Apartment/Walk-Up/Condominium/GardenApartment/Low-Rise/Flat/Mid-Rise (Multi-Family) – 3 or More Units

Building with a group of individual units with 2 or more common walls; attached to other units; separate entrances, and may have common staircases.

- Each building may have an end unit, inside unit, top unit, bottom unit, etc.
- Usually, but not always, have units on both sides of building.
- Apartments usually have one owner while condominiums are usually individually owned.

2. High-Rise Apartment (Multi-Family) – 5 or More Units

A multi-unit building; 5 or more stories; sharing one or more common entrances (may have elevator).

3. Row House/Townhouse/Triplex/Fourplex/Multiplex (Multi-Family) - 3 or More Units

An individual unit attached to other individual units; 1 or more common walls; separate ground level entrances; 1 or 2 story units.

- Each building will have end units and inside units.
- Fourplex units usually share 2 common walls; can be square-shaped or L-shaped.
- Triplex building can be V-shaped.

4. Semi-Detached/Duplex (Multi-Family)

Building with 2 individual housing units; with separate entrances; one common wall; 1 or 2 story units.

5. Detached House (Single-Family)

A detached building intended to house one family; sits on its own piece of land; not attached to another dwelling.

6. Manufactured/Mobile Home (Single-Family)

A detached movable or portable housing structure; at least 32 feet in length and over 8 feet in width; constructed to be towed on its own chassis and designed to be installed with or without a permanent foundation.

• May be 2 or more units fitted together to make one residence.

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SECTION 8 CONSUMPTION SOURCES AND ADJUSTMENTS

SECTION 8 CONSUMPTION SOURCES AND ADJUSTMENTS

We have utilized HUD's engineering-methodology tool for developing the base consumptions and utility allowances for the Section 8 Program. The Microsoft Excel spreadsheet HUD Utility Schedule Model (**HUSM-Ver13i_813_Summit-Update**) is available on HUD User's website.

Note: HUSM-Ver13i_813_Summit-Update includes allowances for a Heat Pump for Electric space Heating. Only <u>one</u> type of Heating should be chosen for determining the total utility allowances for a unit.

HUSM is a tool provided by HUD for use in Section 8 HCV utility allowances. HUD realizes there may be errors or discrepancies in the database regarding consumptions and adjustments, and expects the user to correct them as needed.

The Nelrod Company and its ResidentLife Utility Allowance division assume no liability for discrepancies in the HUD HUSM Tool or from uses of the outcome data produced and utilized for utility allowances.

This tool provides for a choice of "None" (Standard), "Energy Star", "LEED", or "Significant Green Retrofit", utility allowances.

The HUSM tool provides a choice of locations for the climatic adjustment of the base consumptions, by housing agency code or zip code. For agencies that cover more than one climatic zone, we utilize climatic data from the PHA_Average_HDD-CDD spreadsheet to determine the appropriate base consumptions.

HUD's tool combines consumptions and allowances for the building types, **Row House and Semi-Detached** together on one form HUD-52667.

Water average consumption is based on a national average, acquired via internet research, per building type and bedroom size.

Since HUSM only provides export of the results of the calculations on the form HUD-52667, we have provided in this report Cost of Consumption charts showing how the allowances are calculated for each applicable building type, fuel type and bedroom size.

Tenant Purchased Refrigerator and/or Range:

Allowances for ranges and refrigerators must be based on the lesser of the cost of leasing or installment purchasing of suitable equipment (reference Instructions to Form HUD-52667). This allowance is not intended to cover the cost of purchase or lease of the appliance. The maintenance of a landlord-provided appliance is the responsibly and cost of the landlord. This allowance is provided to supplement the tenant-supplied appliance's maintenance cost.

This amount is added to the monthly utility allowance only if the dwelling unit was not furnished with a refrigerator, a range (stove), or for a SRO (Single Room Occupancy-studio unit) a microwave, and the tenant has had to purchase or lease the appliance(s). Note: An allowance cannot be given for both a range and a microwave.



This monthly fee, as defined in the municipal code, funds the maintenance and repair of roadways, signs, signals and markings, sidewalks and urban trails. This includes annual street resurfacing and other maintenance activities necessary for keeping Austin connected and our infrastructure in good $\frac{70}{10}$ condition. By managing and maintaining public right of way infrastructure, the City of Austin is able to save taxpayer money by intervening before full reconstruction is needed. Full street reconstruction can be costly and time-consuming, therefore preventative maintenance provided by the fee helps reduce these costs.

As part of the annual budget process, Austin City Council reviews and adjusts the fee based on current needs. Residents can expect to see the new rate go into effect during the November billing cycle. For residential customers, the fee is a variable monthly rate.



Austin Resource Recovery provides bundled services to manage your **<u>recycling</u>** (<u>http://www.austintexas.gov/department/single-stream-recycling</u>), <u>composting</u> (/composting), <u>trash (http://www.austintexas.gov/department/residential-trash-collection</u>), <u>large brush (/brush)</u> and <u>bulk collection (/department/residential-bulk-collection)</u>. Costs are based on your trash cart size.

We offer four trash cart sizes; choose the size that best fits your household's needs. Save money on your utility bill by recycling and composting as much as possible so that you can switch to a smaller trash cart.

Small (24-gallon)	\$26.20*
Medium (32-gallon)	\$27.65*
Large (64-gallon)	\$33.40*
Extra Large (96-gallon)	\$58.40*

Learn about the base fee

The base fee on the Solid Waste Services section of the City of Austin utility bill pays for curbside recycling, composting, brush and bulk collection. Because all these services are bundled into one base fee, you will still be charged for the services even if you opt-out or choose not to participate in one or more services. Austin Resource Recovery encourages you to recycle and compost as much as possible so you can save on your utility bill by choosing a smaller, less expensive trash cart.

Change the size of your trash cart

You may downsize to a smaller trash cart at no charge. If you switch to a larger trash cart, you will be charged a \$15 one-time cart exchange fee. Administrative rules require that each household have an extra large trash cart before requesting an additional cart. The City also requires that customers' recycling capacity be equal to or larger than their trash capacity. To change your trash cart size, call 512-494-9400.

Learn about extra trash fees

Extra bags of trash that do not fit in your trash cart with the lid closed must be placed next to the trash cart and tagged with an **<u>extra trash sticker (https://www.austintexas.gov/extratrash)</u>,** which can be purchased at most local grocery stores for \$5 plus tax. Extra bags without a sticker will be charged \$10.20 plus tax per bag.

Learn about the clean community fee

All residents in Austin, including single-family homes and apartment and condo dwellers, pay a monthly \$5.45 Clean Community Fee (this includes the Austin Resource Recovery portion only and is a price increase of \$0.45, effective October 1, 2024) for services that keep Austin clean and enhance the livability of our neighborhoods and the downtown area. The Clean Community Fee funds the following:

ACTION

The Board is being asked to approve revisions to HACA's hybrid work policy, grievance policy, and extend the introductory period for new hires to 180 days.

SUMMARY

Background:

The Housing Authority of the City of Austin's Personnel Policy Manual outlines expectations, rights, responsibilities, and procedures related to various aspects of employment, such as recruitment, performance management, compensation, benefits, and workplace behavior. The purpose of a personnel policy is to provide clear, consistent guidelines that ensure fairness, transparency, and compliance with laws and regulations.

Process:

Proposed revisions to the HACA Personnel Policy Manual involve three primary topics: 1) hybrid work policy update; 2) grievance policy; and 3) increased introductory period for new employees.

Hybrid work policy:

In October 2021, a Hybrid Work Policy was approved and adopted by HACA's Board of Commissioners, that allowed staff to work from home for up to three(3) days per week, with two (2) days in the office. That work model worked effectively in attracting and retaining staff during the COVID pandemic.

As the work landscape has continued to evolve, HACA has decided to revise its hybrid work policy to require three (3) days/week in the office in order to further strengthen team collaboration, improve communication, and ensure that employees remain closely connected to our organizational culture. With this

adjustment, we aim to create more opportunities for in-person interactions that drive innovation and foster stronger relationships among colleagues.

HACA leadership supports the continuation of a hybrid work policy in consideration of supporting employee work-life balance and in order to remain competitive within the current labor market.

Grievance Policy

Upon consultation with outside general counsel, HACA is updating its grievance policy for employees to remove reference to termination of employment. HACA's grievance policy applies solely to current/active employees. Recommendations to terminate employment are made in consultation with Human Resources and outside general counsel. The final decision to terminate employment rests with the President/CEO of HACA. Termination is therefore not an eligible action for a grievance.

Introductory Period for new employees

HACA proposes increasing the introductory (probationary) period for new hires from 90 days to 180 days to allow for a more thorough evaluation of their performance, skills, and fit within the organization. This extended period will provide both the employee and HACA more time to assess long-term compatibility, ensuring that new hires are fully integrated and aligned with our culture and expectations. It will also provide more time for development and training, allowing HACA to make more informed assessment about employee performance and potential for success.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends Board approval of the proposed revisions to the HACA Personnel Policy. Revisions will go into effect immediately.

HACA's Hybrid Work Policy

PURPOSE

The Housing Authority of the City of Austin (HACA) supports flexible and hybrid work practices that assist our staff with balancing their work and personal lives when feasible under applicable business circumstances. The purpose of this policy is to describe how employees may work in a "hybrid" manner (i.e. both from the office and from home) and the conditions that will apply when performing work under this arrangement.

Hybrid working is an important element of HACA's:

- a. Strategy for adapting to, and thriving in, the new working environment during and following the coronavirus pandemic; and
- b. Commitment to supporting a positive work-life balance for our employees.

Hybrid working is an initiative that allows greater flexibility and balance for HACA employees, while still allowing for employees to perform their job duties without interruption to HACA's mission. The ability to work hybrid is a privilege and not an entitlement or agency-wide benefit and is granted at the sole discretion of HACA. This policy is not intended to be utilized by employees as a substitute for childcare or adult care of family members. The determination of whether staff are eligible to participate and approved for a hybrid work arrangement will be made in accordance with this policy and business needs.

A. Who is Eligible?

Hybrid work is available for positions with essential functions that can be performed from home/remotely. Hybrid work is not suitable for all positions within the agency, as some employees cannot perform their essential job functions from home or remotely. To the extent possible, eligibility for hybrid work will be included in the description for each position.

HACA expects employees approved for hybrid work to spend at least **two three** days per week in the workplace/office. HACA will determine, at its sole discretion, the amount of days and which days an employee is required to physically report to the office. The employee's schedule will outline which days they are expected to be present in the office and the days on which they are expected to work from home. Employees should meet with their supervisor to determine which days they will be expected to be in the office.

An employee's eligibility for hybrid work, as well as the number of days per week each employee spends in the workplace or office compared with working remotely and which days each employee must be in the office, will vary, depending on:

- the nature of their role;
- what is happening within their role and team at any particular time; individual

circumstances, including performance issues within the past 12 months • the needs of our organization, including the space available at work locations;

- Their contact with residents; and
- HACA's business needs

Employees are expected to adhere to their normal hours of work as set out in their schedule or otherwise communicated by their supervisor. Employees should ensure that when they work from home or remotely they are available to be contacted at all times throughout the workday (as if they were in the office), except for authorized breaks and approved scheduled leave. If an employee is unavailable for any reason they should inform their manager in advance and note unavailability on shared work calendars.

Regardless of the approved schedule, employees are expected to be able to report to the workplace or office as needed. At its discretion, HACA may require an employee to report to HACA's premises (or any other work location) on particular days, including days on which an employee has been previously approved to work from home. When possible, HACA will *try to* provide at least one business day's advance notice when requiring an employee to report to HACA's premises; however, such notice is not guaranteed.

B. Arrangements while working remotely

a. Working hours

While working remotely, employees must be available and working during normal hours of work, as set out in the employee's schedule or otherwise, unless a different arrangement has been pre-approved by the employee's supervisor.

Employees must have their webcam turned on, be visible, and wear work-appropriate attire for all meetings that are attended virtually.

Employees are expected to take lunch breaks during each work day. Employees working at home are not permitted to skip lunch breaks to "bank" or accumulate weekly hours. Skipping lunch breaks must be approved in advance by a supervisor. For example, an employee scheduled to work 40 hours per week, from 8 to 5, Monday to Friday, with a lunch break should not skip lunch Monday to Thursday and "bank" those four hours to achieve 40 hours of work before Friday at 5.

Employees should make use of tools such as shared online calendars; this can help colleagues to be aware of an employee's availability, whether working remotely or in the office.

b. Performance Expectations

Employees are expected to meet performance standards at all times.

c. Workspaces

When working outside of the office, Employees are expected to have a suitable workspace that is free from distractions, in order to be able to perform the functions and tasks of the job. Providing care for a younger minor child or for an aging/disabled household member during work hours does not meet the definition of a suitable workspace that is free from distractions. If applicable, employees must certify that they have adequate childcare or adult care secured. If an employee is not able to perform any portion or task while working from home, that employee must inform their supervisor.

d. Sickness

When working remotely, employees should not work if they are sick. If an employee is sick and unable to work, they should follow HACA's attendance policy. The employee should notify their manager by telephone and/ or email as soon as reasonably practicable before they are due to start work and in any event no later than one hour after they are due to begin work.

e. Non-Primary Place of Work

HACA will determine the employee's primary place of work outside of the office. If an employee needs to work from a non-primary place of work, it is the employee's responsibility to inform their supervisor. An employee that needs to travel out of state or work from a non-primary place of work for an extended period of time (one week or more) while working under this policy, must obtain prior approval from Human Resources and their supervisor.

C. Technology and Equipment

i. HACA-Issued Equipment

To assist employees when working remotely, HACA may provide a laptop computer. Employees are responsible for ensuring they have a reliable high-speed internet connection with a minimum 20MB connection, in order to perform their job duties.

Employees must take care of any HACA-issued equipment and must notify their supervisor and the TMI department of any faults or issues with the equipment or software. If additional equipment is requested, employees should submit a TMI work order. All equipment requests are subject to TMI and/or supervisor approval.

In addition, the laptop and other equipment provided by HACA must be used for workrelated purposes **only** and must not be used by any other member of an employee's household or third party at any time or for any purpose.

If HACA-owned equipment is damaged or stolen while in the employee's possession, the employee may be financially responsible for the replacement of the equipment. If damage or theft occurs, an incident report should be submitted to TMI and additional departments as stated in the Incident Report Procedures.

ii. Use of Personal Computer for Remote Work

Upon approval, an employee may use a personal computer when working remotely when the following items are confirmed by TMI:

- Employee must have an active paid version of antivirus software and must have firewall protection activated; and
- Employee must have appropriate licenses for the software applications on the computer; and
- Employees using personal computers will remote to a computer located at the office to perform their work. All work must be saved on department drives for backup purposes; and
- Employees must ensure the physical security of the computer (e.g. not leaving it unattended or in a position where it is liable to be stolen)

iii. Data protection

Employees working remotely are responsible for keeping information associated with our organization secure at all times. Specifically, remote workers are under a duty to:

- practice good computer security, including using a unique password for your work laptop and any other devices you use for work;
- keep all hard copies of work-related documentation secure, including keeping documents locked away at all times except when in use; and
- ensure that work-related information is safeguarded when working in public spaces, for example by:
- o positioning your laptop so that others cannot see the screen;
- o not leaving your laptop unattended; and
- o not having confidential/business-sensitive conversations in public spaces.

D. Insurance

Employees should be aware that the HACA does not insure any employeeowned equipment, furniture, or other property used when an employee works remotely or from home.

E. Health and Safety

Employees should work with their supervisor/manager to ensure that their remote working setup is appropriate and they are working in a safe manner. However, the employee must also take responsibility for their own health and safety and that of anyone else who is affected by their work (for example others in the household when an employee is working from home).

An employee must notify their supervisor/manager immediately if:

• they feel any discomfort due to working remotely (such as back pain); or

- they believe that there are any work-related health and safety hazards;
- any work-related accidents occur in the home.

The employee's supervisor/manager will discuss the matter with the HR department to look into what action can be taken. The employee should also report any other relevant incidents to their supervisor immediately (security issues, theft of Company property, etc).

F. Expectations When Working Remotely <u>and</u> in the Workplace Employees working remotely and onsite remain subject to relevant HACA policies and procedures. Employees working remotely from home or on-site are responsible for maintaining a safe work environment.

G. Supervisor Responsibility

Supervisors are responsible for adhering to and enforcing this policy, including preparing written descriptions of the approved hybrid schedule and obtaining a signed copy of this policy to provide to Human Resources.

H. Reasonable Accommodation

This policy does not apply to requests for reasonable accommodation for a disability or occasional work-from-home arrangements, such as in instances of inclement weather. Employees requesting a change in schedule or work arrangements as a reasonable accommodation should follow HACA's procedures on requests for reasonable accommodation.

I. Other Policies

Employees and staff are encouraged to read this policy in conjunction with other relevant Company policies, including HACA's:

- Code of Conduct
- Employee Dress Code
- Anti-Harassment Policy
- Attendance Policy

J. Breaches of This Policy

A breach of this policy may result in revocation of the hybrid work schedule and in disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment.

K. Termination of the Hybrid Work Arrangement

All hybrid work arrangements are subject to ongoing review by the supervisor

and Human Resources and may be terminated at any time. HACA may terminate the hybrid work arrangement at its discretion. Where possible, supervisors will give employees advance notice of two weeks if a decision is made to terminate the arrangement; however, advance notice is not required. Refusal to return to the office will be considered a voluntary resignation of employment.

XI. GRIEVANCES

While HACA strives to promote open and honest communication as well as problem solving at the lowest administrative level possible, there are occasions when issues cannot be resolved. Section eleven presents the policies and procedures for employees to exercise their rights to register a grievance (also known as a complaint) regarding the conditions of their employment. This section outlines how to file a grievance, the steps and levels a grievance can take, and how a final resolution is achieved.

The purpose of the Grievance policy is to afford all employees of HACA the opportunity to seek prompt and fair internal resolution of all work-related grievances related to their employment. The Grievance policy is intended to supplement the "Open Door Policy" described in this Manual. The "Open Door Policy" says HACA's philosophy is that all employees have free access to their immediate supervisors or to other appropriate HACA supervisors to informally express their work-related concerns. HACA will attempt to treat all grievances and their investigation as confidential, recognizing, however, that in the course of investigating and resolving internal grievances some dissemination of information to others may be appropriate and unavoidable. HACA intends, whenever possible, that grievances be resolved at the lowest possible administrative level. Agreement to comply with the Grievance policy and Hearing procedures is a condition of employment and continued employment.

Grievances shall be divided into two (2) separate categories. The first category is Conditions of Work – Grievances related to an employee's conditions of work, which shall include but not be limited to compensation, benefits, exempt status, hours, discipline less than probation, or other general conditions of the job; allegations of unlawful discrimination in employment on the basis of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, age, religion, military status, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation, gender identification, genetic information, harassment or retaliation, in violation of any federal, state or local law; grievances against another HACA employee; or violations of any local, state, or federal statute applicable to the employee's employment.

The second category is Disciplinary Grievances – Grievances related to evaluation, reassignment, discipline involving probation or more, demotion, denials of promotions, or suspension ; and "whistleblower" types of complaints or charges of retaliation.

This policy regarding grievances does not affect any other policy in the Manual, and may be changed at any time without the notification or consent of HACA employees.

HACA Personnel Policy and Procedures

(Below are tracked changes to the Policy that pertain to the Introductory Period for new employees)

II. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE ACCOUNTING

B. TIME SHEETS

All employees are required to complete an individual time sheet showing the daily hours worked. Time sheets document the time worked for a two (2) work week period and should be completed by the close of each workday. The following points should be considered in completing time sheets.

- 1. Employees should record their total hours worked for each workday.
- 2. Non-exempt employees are not permitted to sign in or begin work before their normal starting time or to sign out or stop work after their normal quitting time without their supervisor's prior approval.
- 3. Employees are required to take scheduled lunch or meal breaks.
- 4. Employee time sheets should be reviewed and signed by the employee's supervisor. Time not worked for which an employee is entitled to be paid (paid absences, paid holidays, or paid vacation time) should be entered by the employee on the time sheet. Authorized overtime should also be identified by the supervisor.
- 5. All absences during a non-exempt employee's first one hundred eighty (180) days of service (introductory period) will not be paid. Supervisors should inform employees if they will not be paid for certain hours of absence.

D. ALTERNATIVE WORK SCHEDULE

Alternative Work Schedules are at the discretion of the Vice President or the employee's Department Director. In general, except where an alternative work schedule benefits HACA, employees must have been employed with HACA for a minimum of 180 days and received a satisfactory performance evaluation to request an alternative work schedule. Employees are expected to maintain the approved Alternative Work Schedule until authorization to change it is obtained from their supervisor.

F. ATTENDANCE MONITORING

Consequences of No Call/No Show (NC/NS) and Failure to Respond while On-Call

If an employee is NC/NS or fails to respond while on-call, their time shall be uncompensated. The employee will be issued a final written warning effective for twelve (12) months for one (1) NC/NS. The second NC/NS during this twelve (12) month period results in immediate termination of the employee.

If an employee fails to report to work and does not notify his/her supervisor or department for two (2) scheduled shifts without a return to work in between, the employee is considered to have voluntarily resigned without notice as of the last date of active employment.

An employee with a single NC/NS during the one hundred eighty (180) day introductory period will be terminated.

III. HOLIDAYS, LEAVE AND BENEFITS ADDITIONAL DAYS OFF

Employees of HACA are also provided with a "Personal Day" and a "Birthday Day." The Personal Day (each employee receives one per year) is to be scheduled with their supervisor's approval and is available for use at the beginning of each calendar year. New employees who began work with HACA after January 1st do not accrue a Personal Day until the following January 1st. The Birthday Day is to be taken in the timeframe either thirty (30) days before or thirty (30) days after the employee's actual birthday and is also to be scheduled with their supervisor's approval. In the event that the employee's birthday falls during their first one hundred eighty (180) days of employment, upon completion of their introductory period the employee will have up to thirty days (30) to utilize their Birthday Day.

Employees with Less Than One hundred eighty (180) Days of Service

Employees are not permitted to take annual leave until their completion of one hundred eighty (180) calendar days of continuous, uninterrupted HACA service. They will, however, accrue leave during this period. Employees separated during the first one hundred eighty (180) days of continuous HACA employment will not be paid for or entitled to any accrued annual leave. For exempt employees, annual leave will be debited to offset any type of absence such as sick leave or Leave Without Pay during an employee's first one hundred eighty (180) calendar days of continuous service and they may accrue a negative balance.

Annual Leave Upon Resignation or Dismissal

A HACA employee who resigns, is dismissed, or is otherwise separated from HACA employment is entitled to a lump-sum payment for all unused, accrued annual leave provided that the employee has been continuously employed by HACA for at least one hundred eighty (180) days. The maximum accrual to be paid upon resignation or dismissal is 240 hours.

Use During First One hundred eighty (180) Days

During the initial one hundred eighty (180) day introductory period, employees will not be allowed to take paid sick leave. During an employee's one hundred eighty (180) day introductory period, one (1) sick leave occurrence will result in counseling by the immediate supervisor. This counseling should be documented with a copy provided to the employee and the Human Resources Department. The second sick leave occurrence during the introductory period will result in a written warning. The third sick leave occurrence during an employee's introductory period shall result in disciplinary action up to and including termination. Any disciplinary action taken as a result of three (3) sick leave occurrences shall be reviewed by the President/CEO.

VI. PERSONNEL ACTIONS

TRANSFERS (INTRA-AGENCY)

A transfer within the agency from one department to another is an intra-agency transfer. When the intra-agency transfer is to a position in the same salary range, there is no salary change. When the intra-agency transfer is to a position that is in a lower salary group, it is a demotion. The salary must be reduced at least the equivalent of one step. When the intra-agency transfer is to a position in a higher salary group, it is a promotion. The salary must be increased by the equivalent of at least one step. Regular full-time employees who transfer from one department to another do not have to complete a one hundred eighty (180) day introductory period. The supervisor may, if he/she wishes, write an employee evaluation when the employee has completed one hundred eighty (180) days in the new position. A transferred employee will immediately begin being paid at the rate for the new position. All intra-agency transfers must be reviewed and approved by the Human Resources Director and approved by the President/CEO.

D. TIMEFRAMES FOR TRANSITIONING CONTRACTORS

Contractors can be utilized for a period of up to one hundred eighty (180) days. After one hundred eighty (180) days, a decision should be made based on business needs to either retain or release the contractor. If retained, the contractor should be hired as a regular employee and begin a one hundred eighty (180) day probationary period.

IX. HIRING

I. INTRODUCTORY PERIOD

In order to become a regular full-time employee, each employee must complete an introductory period of one hundred eighty (180) days following initial employment or re-employment in a regular budgeted position. Supervisors should observe carefully the performance of each employee in a new job position. Where appropriate, weaknesses in performance, behavior, or development should be brought to the employee's attention for correction immediately.

The supervisor should prepare a written evaluation of the employee's job performance by the end of the first one hundred eighty (180) days on the new job. The evaluation should include a recommendation as to whether the employee should continue in the position.

Employees generally continue in their new positions if they receive both a satisfactory evaluation by the end of their initial one hundred eighty (180) day employment period and their supervisor's endorsement to continue in their position. Employees who do not receive a satisfactory evaluation and endorsement may be terminated from employment or be given additional time in thirty (30) day increments to demonstrate their ability to perform the job, if the supervisor feels additional time is warranted in order to demonstrate acceptable job performance. Supervisors shall consult with Human Resources first to determine the best course of action.

ACTION

The Board is being asked to approve Resolution No. 02880 to take the following actions with regard to the Bridge at Iron Rock Ranch Apartments (the "Development") in Austin, Texas: (i) acquire the site of the Development; (ii) lease the Development site to the owner of the Development; and (iii) such other actions necessary or convenient to carry out this Resolution.

SUMMARY

Background:

Austin Affordable Housing Corporation (AAHC) has been presented an opportunity to partner with Domain Communities to purchase a 300-unit multi-family rental property called Iron Rock Ranch Apartments. The development is located at 1215 W Slaughter Lane, Austin, Texas 78748. This would be the first asset AAHC and Domain Communities have purchased together. This asset is located on a park-like 22.67-acre site in South Austin, benefiting from proximity to major thoroughfares including I-35 and MoPac Expressway. The property is also within walking distance of Casey Elementary School, less than half a mile from Paredes Middle School and less than two miles to shopping and retail at South Park Meadows.

AAHC's proposed partner, Domain Communities, brings over 30 years of experience in affordable and conventional multifamily housing. Domain Communities served as the exclusive financial advisor and asset manager for nationally recognized non-profit organizations for properties in Phoenix, Mesa, Tempe, Oklahoma City, Tulsa, Dallas and Houston. During this time, Domain launched its Domain Communities Social Programs, which played an essential role in enriching the lives of residents. These programs provided on-site recreation centers, children's workshops, food banks and adult education classes.

Iron Rock Ranch was constructed in 2002 and features 300 units with an average unit size of 1,055 square feet, offering a mix of 1-, 2-, and 3-bedroom apartments, including 84 townhome units. The property offers a variety of amenities, including two resort-style swimming pools, elegant clubhouse with gathering spaces and conference room, fitness center, coffee bar, and business center, two dog parks with dog wash station, grilling areas, gathering pavilion and an overall residential campus atmosphere.

The property was purchased by Domain in 2019, and has since undergone extensive renovations. Over the course of its ownership, Domain has renovated 121 units with the majority being a luxurious spec which highlights include new cabinets, appliances, flooring and finishes. In addition, the property has been relandscaped, the roadways have been resurfaced and re-striped. The property feeds into the Austin Independent School District Casey Elementary School, Paredes Middle School, and Akins High School.

This is an important transaction to HACA and AAHC, as South Austin continues to experience significant economic and population growth, leading to increased displacement of the affordable housing community. The partnership will ensure the preservation of this asset and expand deeper affordability options for voucher holders and other residents in the area. With its proximity to major transportation corridors and its residential appeal, Iron Rock Ranch is strategically positioned to provide stable, affordable housing while maintaining high standards of living.

Below is a breakdown of the many variations of unit sizes. The property is currently 93% occupied and rents currently range from \$1,370 for a one-bedroom to \$2,250 for a three-bedroom.

72 1-bedroom/1-bath	810 square feet

Process:

The refinancing proceeds are estimated to be \$47,912,000. Domain Communities will bring \$22,500,000 in equity, with \$2,100,000 will be set aside for operating capital and final capital improvements. A current lease audit is underway to determine the initial number of units already qualified under 80% AMI. The property is currently 93% occupied. AAHC and Domain Communities are committed to providing 10% of the affordable units at 60% AMI, 40% of the units at 80% AMI and leasing units to qualified voucher holders.

Apartment Management Professionals will manage the property. The new name for the property will be Bridge at Iron Rock Ranch Apartments.

WHEREAS, Austin Affordable Housing Corporation ("AAHC") has agreed to participate in the acquisition and rehabilitation of the Development;

WHEREAS, in connection therewith, the Housing Authority of the City of Austin ("HACA") has agreed to acquire certain real property in the full purpose jurisdiction of the City of Austin, Texas with an address of 1215 W. Slaughter Lane, Austin, Travis County, Texas 78748 (the "Land"), which constitutes the site for the Development, and to simultaneously lease the Land to Domain Iron Rock Apartments II, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, whose managing member is controlled by an affiliate of AAHC (the "Owner"), under a long-term ground lease (the "Ground Lease");

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of HACA hereby approves and adopts the following resolutions, and hereby authorizes its Chief Executive Officer (or the Chief Executive Officer's designee) to do the following:

- 1. Acquire the Land and enter into the Ground Lease with the Owner.
- 2. Review, execute and approve the Ground Lease and all such other documents necessary to effectuate the acquisition of the Land, execution of the Ground Lease and Owner's acquisition of the Development, including but not limited to such security instruments and estoppel certificates as any lender involved with the Development may require, all on such terms and containing such provisions as the Chief Executive Officer (or his designee) shall deem appropriate, and the approval of the terms of each such instrument shall be conclusively evidenced by his execution and delivery thereof.

This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and upon its adoption.

ITEM TITLE: Presentation, Discussion and Possible Action regarding Resolution No: 02882: Approval of renewal of Employee Medical, Vision, and Dental Insurance with United Healthcare

ACTION

As part of its comprehensive compensation package, the Housing Authority of the City of Austin (HACA) currently offers its regular full-time employees medical, vision and dental insurance coverage through United Healthcare's Navigate plan.

Process:

Over the course of several months in mid to late 2024, HACA staff met with the Gallagher Group, HACA's insurance brokers, to discuss the upcoming insurance renewal for the 2025-2026 fiscal year. United Healthcare initially proposed a 24% increase to our current coverage based on utilization rate throughout the plan year. Upon consultation with Gallagher, HACA determined it was not in the organization's best interest to issue a Request for Proposals from the insurance market at this time.

Through a series of negotiations between United Healthcare and the Gallagher Group, United Healthcare ultimately revised its proposed rate to 18.4% rate increase for medical coverage, 10% rate increase for dental coverage, and a rate pass for vision coverage. This was based on HACA's demographics and claims experience. Last year, HACA received a 19% rate increase.

With this renewal, employees will benefit from a continuity of coverage with no changes to health plans. HACA will continue to offer employees the Navigate plan; it is considered a Health Maintenance Organization (HMO). Under this plan employees are required to select a Primary Care Physician (PCP) from United Healthcare and employees are also required to obtain a referral in order to see a United Healthcare Specialist.

Based on our current demographics and utilization rate as a whole, HACA believes the proposed rate increase to renew the Navigate Plan with United Healthcare is reasonable and fiscally responsible. In addition, for the fiscal year 2025-2026, HACA will continue to impose the surcharge of \$50 per month, to employees who choose to continue to use tobacco products. Employees may participate in and complete a tobacco cessation program if they wish to avoid the surcharge.

Staff Recommendation:

In an effort to provide employees with the best affordable, available healthcare coverage, HACA recommends United Healthcare be awarded the renewal contract to provide employee medical, vision and dental insurance coverage for the 2025-2026 fiscal year by utilizing United Healthcare's Navigate Plan.
